100 years of Polish Independence

This year marks the centenary of Polish Independence. As well as all around the country, our school will likewise be taking part in the anniversary celebrations!

In 1795, after the third partition of Poland by Russia, Austria and Prussia, Poland disappeared from the map of Europe.

During the 123 years of captivity, uprisings were constantly taking place, which, however, did not bring the desired sovereignty. Finally, in the wake of the First World War, thanks to the hardships and strength of the Polish nation, on 11th November 1918, Poland regained independence, taking its rightful place on the world map once again.

The most important activists in the struggle for the freedom of this period are: Józef Piłsudski (Supreme Commander of the Polish Army), Roman Dmowski (Minister of Foreign Affairs), Ignacy Paderewski (independence activist, composer) and Wincenty Witos (three-time prime minister).

We are commemorating this amazing milestone at our school, as well as it will surely be celebrated all over Poland and different places internationally.

“NO WOMAN NO KRAJ” – 100 YEARS OF WOMEN’S RIGHTS

This November marks 100 years after Polish women were granted the right to vote!

On **28th November 1918**, Józef Piłsudski signed an Election Regulation Decree stating that every Polish citizen, man and woman alike, was a voter.
